

legislation favors some regions of the country over others. It appears that Coloradans may have to bear a disproportionate share of carbon emission control costs if the proposed legislation is passed without modification.

The card asked that legislation be fair, stating, “Climate change legislation needs to recognize regional differences in how electricity is produced. I should not be penalized because of where I live.”

Next, it asked the Senators to keep affordability in mind. Finally, it asked that Senators only pass legislation that is achievable, saying “Climate change mandates must be realistic to ensure long-term success.”
